ANYONE FOR ROLE PLAYING? A very special plea for very special volunteers was made at the executive meeting by Don Freeman, General Manager of the Enoch Turner School Foundation. This school attempts to give students the actual experience of going to school in 1850. Classes are booked into the school for a morning or afternoon session, Tuesday to Thursday. First, the students view a film of life in Toronto in 1850 so that they may be prepared for the transition to a class room of the period. Lessons are carefully planned to conform to the style of teaching and class control of the era. The school needs 8 to 12 volunteers for next year.
