The Toronto Intergenerational Project, in co-operation with the Toronto Board of Education, is launching an intervention project to assist students-at-risk. Called <u>Elder Mentors</u>, the project will match a caring older person with a young adolescent who, for a range of reasons, has been identified as being "at-risk".

The assumption underlying this initiative is that a surrogate "grand friend" with available flexible time and a lifetime of valuable experience can make a difference in the life of a troubled youth.
