This group links the transportation needs of Canadians requiring medical treatment or diagnosis outside their home community with a network of unused aircraft seats from corporate, government, private and commercial aircraft owners. As flight operations and new programs expand, there is an urgent need for volunteers to help maintain M.A.T.N. operations. Most volunteers begin by providing general office support (mail, photocopying, filing) and by taking requests for transportation over the telephone. As the volunteer becomes more familiar with the services, opportunities to participate in programs such as sponsor recruitment, health care liaison, hotel accommodations, fund-raising or public relations may become available.
