Supplemental Plan: Outside Province/Canada Emergency Medical Plan (#983432)

This plan is for participants who travel for periods over 60 days. The plan renews automatically each September to allow travellers to spread their premium payments over a 12month period rather than making a lump sum payment. The intent of the automatic renewal is that travellers will advise Johnson Insurance of their new travel dates each year before leaving on their trip.

Last year many participants cancelled their coverage and subsequently re-enrolled in the plan a few months later. The administrative costs of cancellation and re-enrolment are prohibitive. Effective September 1, 1994, a policy fee of \$50.00 will be charged to participants who cancel and re-enrol in the plan within the same policy year (September 1 to August 31).

The renewal notification will explain the automatic renewal and the process of changing travel dates. Travel dates may be changed at any time by calling Johnson Insurance. Written confirmation will be sent to you detailing your travel coverage.

OTHER NEWS

Every year 17,000 people in Ontario are treated for prescription drug problems. One in five seniors admitted to hospital is there because of difficulty with medications.

How you can use prescription drugs safely:

- tell your doctor and your pharmacist about all the drugs you are taking, including the drugs you buy off the shelf and any non-Ontario Drug Benefit prescription drugs
- never take drugs prescribed for someone else
- follow the directions for use. Never take more or less of a prescribed drug. Be sure to take it for the length of time your doctor recommends.
- return any unused drugs to your pharmacist. Don't store them in your home.
- be sure to report any side effects to your doctor.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 47TH SENATE (OCTOBER 25 & 26, 1994) (Reported by Arlene Freeman)

- 1. O.T.F. (Ontario Teachers' Federation) is not willing to provide reasons for rescinding the present policy of 90 days teaching after retirement.
- 2. O.T.F. continues to refuse S.T.O./E.R.O. representation on the Pension Plan Board.
- 3. The Executive Director of O.T.F., Bill Jones, retires from his position from S.T.O./E.R.O. in June 1995 and will be an Executive Officer of C.A.R.T. (Canadian Association of Retired Teachers).
- 4. All health and insurance plans are healthy.....There has been more input than output.
