## Comments concerning a workshop on LONG TERM CARE SENIOR SERVICES IN THE COMMUNITY held on April 17, 1996 at the Toronto Board of Education.

An excellent presentation was given by **Dian Goldstein**, chair of the Metro Consumers for Community-based Long Term Care and by **Evelyn Turner**, a Steering Committee member, as well as chair for the committee which is involved in outreach and education of consumers and the general public.

Metro Consumers for Community-based Long-term Care is a network of individuals and consumer organizations in the Metropolitan Toronto Community, concerned about the accessibility, delivery, quality and accountability of community-based long-term care services. These services are intended for patients who are <u>not</u> in retirement homes, but rather those individuals who prefer to remain in their own homes. Another aspect of care refers to those who are discharged from hospitals too early and who require personal care workers at home.

In order, therefore, to maintain or enhance the functioning of an individual and to help them manage independently, the professional services that can be used in the long-term care situation are, nurses, homemakers, personal services, meals-on-wheels, transportation and home help.

Both speakers were concerned about the new changes in the province's new intake/assessment referral agencies, referred to as the Community Care Access Centres (C.C.A.C.) Some of the concerns that were mentioned were:

- 1) What services will consumers be entitled to under the new framework? Will access be more restricted?
- 2) Will access to long term care be simplified or will it be more confusing?
- 3) Will consumer support services be maintained at the current level?

#### FROM THE PENSION CONCERNS COMMITTEE

- 1. In response to our invitation, an encouraging number of members indicated the desire for a meeting. We plan to do so once the present round of Provincial negotiations have been completed. These are going very slowly, but we hope that a meeting will be held next winter or early spring.
- 2. Pensioners who are planning to apply for, or have recently begun receiving Canada Pension Plan payments, MUST remember that Income Tax is not automatically deducted at source. The current Maximum monthly is \$727.08 or \$8,724.96 annually. Therefore, Income Tax owed could range from \$2388 to \$4218 (\$200 to \$350 a month).
- 3. It is possible to transfer C.P.P. payments to a spouse with a lower income, thus reducing taxes. Bob Putnam will have more on this in a later issue.
- 4. The committee welcomes **Bill Tajer** as our newest member.


