Paul Martin, if certain information can be obtained by STO/ERO, he will look into the tax problems of those who received a pension correction payment. What the provincial STO/ERO office needs is your **name** and **Social Insurance Number**, if you were one of those whose pension was corrected by the payment of a lump sum, no matter how small. Pascal LaRouche, our officer in charge, visited with the Minister in December. The Minister requested that our office share with him the total number of pensioners who received this money and how much they received. Although the Pension Board has this data, they seem to be reluctant to release the information to Pascal. This, therefore, requires that we collect this data manually. Only <u>YOU</u> can help in this matter. Please call the Office at (416) 962-9463. We would like the information we forward to Ottawa to be as accurate as our members' assistance can provide.

If you were among the group who was initially underpaid, and you have not contacted the STO/ERO office already, it may be to your advantage to do so. It will also aid your tax preparer if you call the Pension Board and ask for a breakdown of the amount you received and the basis on which the calculations were made. In our previous letter we asked you to help. This will be a major way in which you can assist both yourself and others, if we are able to obtain this information to relay to the tax department.

Another promise to which we can look forward is our May Luncheon, more news of that will be revealed below. Read on. We hope to see you in May.

CARE WATCH TORONTO

This non-profit voluntary organization provides information to those receiving services at present and to those who may need them in the future.

You may find enclosed with your newsletter, a pamphlet that provides information concerning people who might require long-term care services such as the frail and elderly with physical or mental disabilities and those with chronic illnesses. These services can include nursing, personal care, homemaking, caregiver relief, meals-on-wheels and transportation.

Community-based long-term care is provided to those requiring help to live in their own home or apartment with independence and dignity. Some of these programmes are provided at no cost to the consumer, others are on a sliding scale.

- the possibility of a drug card in the future

- the possibility of direct billing by the pharmacist to Johnson Inc. for prescription drugs 3. <u>Income Tax Reminder</u>

You may be eligible to claim medical expenses on your 1997 tax return. You should read the section on Medical Expenses in the General Income Tax Guide for 1997.

In the case of a couple, the person with the lower income should make the medical claim. You are reminded that the premiums, including PST, are tax deductible. Any parts of claims unpaid by Johnson Inc. or other medical expenses not covered by the Plans can be claimed for Income Tax purposes.

Receipts for the health plan premiums are not required by Revenue Canada. Attach a note to your tax return stating that the Plan is underwritten by Maritime Life, and give the Plan name and number for the applicable coverage.

For your convenience I have included the PST, for Ontario members, in the premiums for each of the Plans. GST is not applicable.
