PRESIDENT JIM BAKER ACKNOWLEDGES THRONE SPEECH ANNOUNCEMENT

Jim Baker was anxious to let the government know RTO/ERO's feelings about the announcement in the Speech from the Throne. Here is the text of his letter to Premier Mike Harris.

Dear Honourable Michael Harris:

On behalf of the over 41,000 retired teachers who are members of The Retired Teachers of Ontario/les enseignantes et enseignants retraites de l'Ontario (RTO/ERO) allow me to acknowledge, with gratitude, the tremendous commitment made by your government in yesterday's Speech from the Throne.

For several years, RTO/ERO has been advocating for a more direct voice over decisions related to the pension plan in which its members have invested their retirement savings.

Our members, their spouses and families are greatly encouraged by this initiative. We look forward to working with your government and the officials of the Ontario Teachers' Federation. We believe that the direct participation of retired educators in the Ontario Teachers' Pension Plan will prove to be effective.

LOBBYISTS IMPRESSED

Before the Speech from the Throne was even finished, RTO/ERO was receiving complimentary calls from political lobby firms who had heard of our card campaign. One said, "I hope that RTO/ERO realizes just what a tremendous achievement this is (to get a specific promise in the Throne Speech). This is one of the most public commitments that a government can give to undertake a promised action. The fact that it appeared in a Throne Speech guarantees that the item is on THE list of action items for the government to do."

MEDIA CONTACT RTO/ERO

"Who are you people and how did you get the government to promise this?" questions from media to this effect came while the speech was underway. The government provides media with advance copies of speeches such as the Throne Speech in a "lock-up" before it is presented in Legislature. The Lieutenant-Governor had not yet read our "good news", when the media started to call asking who we were and what this might mean for retired members of the Ontario Teachers' Plan. Jim Baker explained that we were seeking to have a more meaningful and effective say over what happens to our retirement savings invested in the Teachers' Pension Plan. All seemed impressed that we were able to achieve that level of support for our card campaign.

We were also asked to give examples of how RTO/ERO would push to see that pension fund income is used to improve the lot of Plan members.
